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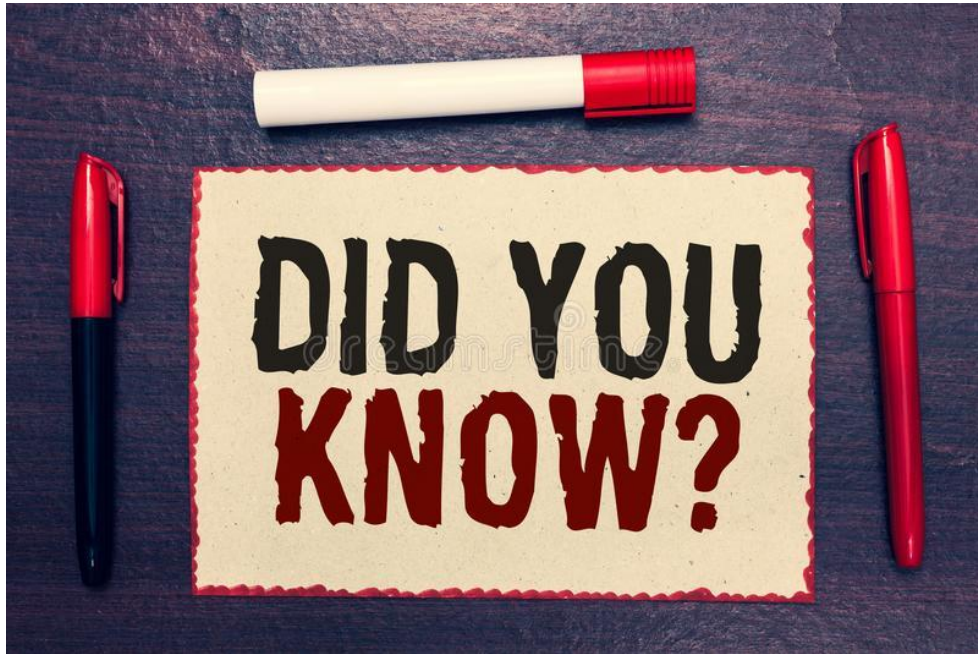

STATEMENT OF FAITH

We believe:

PHILOSOPHY and MISSION

Our philosophy is simple: To teach, evangelize, and edify the Body of Christ, so that they may be fully equipped and sent forth as Christian workers, ministers, and pastors into the harvest field. We recognize the local Church and its mission and do not interfere with its purpose. Our goal is to assist the local Church and its Para-ministries in order to further the Gospel of Christ. The degree programs of the institution are designed primarily for religious vocations. This is both central and consistent in carrying out our mission.



HISTORY

During 1982 Dr. Frank Garofalo began a home bible study in Staten Island New York. As God's word took root in people's lives, the bible study grew and by 1983 Dr. Garofalo began a Church, *Love in Christ Fellowship*. Moving to Brooklyn New York, the church flourished and a need for further growth was evident. Around 1984 Dr. Garofalo's desire was to see bible education and training as a goal within his ministry. While in prayer and the Spirit on day, Dr. Garofalo saw a vision of a barn closed and shut tight. The Spirit of God spoke to him and said, "My people are starving, my barn is filled and there is no one to feed them." Dr. Garofalo replied, "Lord what I must do to feed them?" To which the Spirit of God said, "Feed them of My Spirit." As soon as He spoke, the locks on the barn broke and a Dove flew out.

Upon hearing from the Lord, Dr. Garofalo began a bible school, *NYC Full Gospel Bible Institute* under the *Full Gospel Assemblies International*. He pursued from that time, and to present, the commission of teaching, training, and sending forth workers into the harvest of the Lord Jesus Christ. The bible school gained momentum and in 1990, due to the demand for urban ministry and credentialed ministers, the school grew into a seminary.

From its beginnings, *NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary* has seen numerous licensed and ordained graduate students, many of whom are in wonderful ministries today. As the students were being credentialed, Dr. Garofalo saw a need for the students to be apart of an organization of ministerial fellowship. In 1992, Dr. Garofalo began *The National Association of Christian Counselors, Ministers and Churches* through *NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary*. Besides being a resource to graduating students, the association is comprised of many churches, ministers and counselors. Currently the seminary is training people through out the United States and overseas as well.

ACCREDITATION (Documentation)

Although the word seminary may imply graduate training for higher institutional learning, NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary has been established for the sole purpose of training and issuing credentials to men and women as certified licensed and ordained ministers. The Seminary is incorporated and filed with the IRS as an exempt Church and educational school. With this status, we may train as well as ordain and commission Churches.

Our emphasis is not to achieve a secular accreditation, nor claim to issue secular credit under the US Department of Education or State agencies, although we issue certificates, diplomas, and degrees for ministry purposes under our religious exemption. Our mission is to equip the minister with practical education for his/her ministry. We continue in this practical path as the means of fulfilling the Great Commission of Jesus Christ.

Exemption Status

The Seminary has obtained exemption status with the FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. The Commission for Independent Education, Religious Institutions, and having complied with Section 1005.06 (1) (f), Florida Statutes pursuant to Religious institutions dated July 19, 2006. The entitlement allows the Seminary to issue religious degree in the Associate, Bachelors, Masters, and Doctorate degree levels with a religious modifier. The Seminary renews the exemption from the Florida Department of Education each year. We rely on our mutual relationships with other institutions of Christian faith for creditability and acceptance of our credits and degrees for ministry purposes.

Admissions & Financial Information

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ADMISSIONS TO THE SEMINARY

The seminary comprises a variety of students who uphold academic integrity and strive for spiritual and personal growth. Applicants must do the same and be committed to the vision and purpose of the school. We strive for individuals who will contribute and be faithful to the seminary as they endeavor in their academic experience.

Requirements

1. Applicants must have a High School Diploma.
2. Two letters of recommendation are needed: one from a clergy person and one from laity.
3. Transfer students must submit a transcript from that school.
4. A brief resume must be submitted from all prospective students
5. Students must complete an application for admission (pg 57-58) and pay the current application fee.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

The Seminary will accept all credits earned in a college, university, or other-level institution, providing an official transcript is received from that institution and that the subject material is similar to that of the Seminary. Courses, which are not similar, are also considered for transfer if they are deemed to be beneficial to the students chosen major. Transferable credit must be in accordance to a passing grade as deemed by the seminary. At present the passing grade for a subject is "D" or equivalent and an average of 70 percent per subject must be achieved.

Transferring NYC Seminary Credits

Each faith-based institution of higher learning reserves its sovereign right to determine what credits it will transfer in toward its degree programs. Therefore, our seminary cannot warrant that its credits will transfer. The student must make that determination by checking with the institution that they may want to transfer credits to.

Program Cost -Non-Credit (Audit)-Certificate Program

The total cost is based upon the earned credit in that subject multiplied by the credit hour cost for ether non-credit or audited student. There is a deduction for non-credit students allowed by the Seminary.



Note: *The program cost section above does not include: application or registration fee, text book or note costs, supervision fee, Certificate/Diploma/Degree preparation fee, and monthly payment plans. Audited non-credit cost is half of the above program cost.*

STUDENT PAYMENT PLANS & DISCOUNTS

At the present time the seminary does *not* offer any Federal Funded Aid or scholarships for financial assistance. However, to help minimize the student's expenses, the seminary does provide payment plans and discounts.

Payment Plans

In order for a payment plan to be applied, the student must first pay the application and registration fee in full. A deposit of 25 % must be paid toward tuition at the start. All these requirements must be done before the students enters a class.

The payment plan is determined by the balance incurred (after the 25 % deposit) for the courses, programs, and fees) divided by the number of months the student is attending. In addition an \$ 9.50 administration fee is applied per month for billing and record keeping. This administration fee also gives students access to on-line services and courses or testing the seminary provides.

Note: Extension plans may be given for students who need additional time to pay off their tuition.

Discounts

(Only one discount may be used)

1. 10% discount for subjects paid in advance.
2. 10% discount for ministers & church leaders.
3. 15% discount for members of *NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary Association of Pastoral Counselors, Ministers, and Churches*.
4. 10 % discount for Senior Citizens: 55 years and older.

REFUND POLICY

A refund may be given for tuition only as follows:

- ◆ before the first class and not more than three days from registration - 100 %
- ◆ the first 10 days from start - 90 %
- ◆ day one of start up to 14 days - 80 %
- ◆ the 14th day to the 21st day - 70 %

A refund **may not** be given under the following circumstances:

- ◆ No refund for registration
- ◆ No refund after the 21st day.
- ◆ No refund for books or notes which are purchased or mailed

FINANCIAL AGREEMENT

The seminary requires that all financial obligations must be met before a student can graduate and receive certificates, diplomas, degrees and or ordination from NYC's National Association. All of the above will be withheld as security interest until the financial obligations are fulfilled.

The seminary reserves the right to change financial policies, tuition costs, and fees at any time from the date of this publication.

TEXT BOOKS & SEMINARY NOTES

Costs

Course textbooks and seminary notes vary depending on the course. The average textbook cost ranges from \$12.99 to \$23.00, while the average seminary notes range

from \$10.00 to 18.00 per subject. There is an additional cost for shipping of all textbooks and seminary notes. This additional expense will be billed to the student and shown on their cost estimate evaluation form.

Note: All prices are subject to change for textbooks, notes as well as tuition and registration costs. Student shall be informed of such charges 48 hours before.

Seminary Policies & Student Life

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REGISTRATION

Students must first fill out and return the *Registration Form* (pg. 45) for entry into the seminary. Upon receiving the registration form, the seminary will return to the student the *Student Cost Estimate Evaluation Form* (pg.46-47) to be signed, notarized, and returned by the student. The *Student Cost Estimate Evaluation* is an analysis by the seminary of a complete cost in which the student will incur. The form indicates the total cost for one or more subjects and or programs to be taken. The Student Cost Estimate Evaluation form shows the student's full payment or installment payment plan that they decided to make. The evaluation also takes into consideration the cost for certificate charges, supervision charges, textbooks or notes required, and any other fees or expenses.

Once the application for entry and the student cost estimate evaluation are completed, the student then purchases textbooks or notes from the school book store department. The course studies are sent to the enrolled student as well.

CREDIT HOUR

The seminary education department uses a uniform standard to evaluate the educational process. The credit hour used by the seminary is usually typical to other institutions. One credit is 15 hours of study or more in a particular course; most courses are three credits. A three (3)-credit course is approximately 45 hours of study or more in that course.

The credit hour is a combination of work assignments during class, homework assignments, and term papers and essays in order to complete the education value for that subject. The term used by the seminary (credit hour) is not for accrediting purpose, but for the learning process value only. The code used in this catalog for credit is (CDT).

NON-CREDIT HOUR (AUDITING)

The Seminary offers all its courses through its *Auditing – not for credit program*. The auditing program allows students to enter theological training for the ministry and prepare for license and ordination with the Seminary without receiving credit. Although the courses taken are at college level, the student may take the course for non-credit and pay half of the tuition cost of an accredited course. They take the same quality courses as credited students do, but for ministry purposes only.

The student does not receive an official credited transcript, but he/she receives an *Audited Not for Credit Transcript* at the end of their studies. In the event a student completes an audited subject or courses and desires college credit, they may do so by completing a transfer application and pay the current differential tuition. At that time, the student's grades will then be recorded on a college-credited transcript. Completion of a course in the Audit program is recorded as a Unit Hour (UH) rather than Credit Hour.

These auditing hours can be done per subject or for certificates in a particular discipline (*Certificate Program*). The student would follow the same programs the seminary offers and upon completion they would receive a certificate for non-credit in Christian Ministries. The Certificate Program is listed below.

LIFE EXPERIENCE & SELF STUDY CREDIT

The Seminary recognizes students who have experienced education through practical life and church experience and studies. Many churches have teaching ministries in their adult education, which may be recognizable as continued Christian education by the seminary. Approval will be based upon a number of factors which may include, the number of years of service, amount of hours devoted to their studies, and experience gained as well as other reasons. The maximum credit that will be given for life experience is limited to 30 credits in an undergraduate level. The Seminary shall examine life credit in a graduate program but limit that credit to one time use and not more than 12 credit hours. We will accept such personal education studies for credit in the following cases:

1. Ministers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ who have an ecclesiastical license with a ministerial association. The Seminary will grant such persons (4) four credit hours for each year that the minister has held ministerial credentials. Proof of such credentials and ministerial experience must accompany the request as well as a letter from the ministerial organization must be submitted upon approval of such credit. A portfolio of documented experience of the minister's work, in their particular ministry duties, must be submitted for examination and evaluation of credit toward the program they are entering.
2. Students who have taken local Church education such as Sunday school training, seminars, educational conferences or other approved continued Christian education experiences. Documentation must accompany the request. A letter from their local Church or educational ministry attended will do. This letter should include a course description and or course title, number of hours spent in the subject(s) taken, and a certificate of completion (if applicable).
3. Persons who have who have prepared, written, and taught others in local Church education, Sunday school classes, and home Bible studies (Personalized Studies and Training of others). Credit will be given per subject or course they prepared and taught. Documentation must accompany such experiences such as a course description, outline, and objectives. Self studies may also be accepted for credit if the student has written papers on topical Christian subjects which were prepared in a college term paper format.

The Seminary Honors Life Experience Knowledge



Note: Students who like to obtain Life Credit through self-experience, the Seminary has an application to be filled out by the student in order for the Seminary to evaluate the credit through life experience. The application is called “**Life Experience Portfolio**” and there is a special fee for the evaluation of \$195.00 to be paid upon submittal. See – apply for life experience credit below >.

Applying for Life Experience Credit

Applicants must first apply and register with the Seminary. Upon registration they request a *Self Study Profile* which provides important information that must be filled out in order to receive credits for life experience. Upon review and evaluation of the Self Study Profile and all required documentation, the student will be informed of acceptance or denial. Payment for life experience credit will be included in the cost of tuition.

STUDY LOAD (PER CREDIT HOUR)

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The Seminary recommends not more than three subjects at 3 credits each to be taken in any semester or nine total credit hours per semester quarter. The student attends 12 classes in total (per subject) each semester at one and a half hours of classroom instruction, equaling 18 hours of instruction. The student completes homework assignments for an additional 18 hours as well as 10 hours devoted to research, papers, and projects. The combination of class instruction, homework, and research, papers, and projects would equal 45 hours or a combination thereof fulfilling the requirement for a 3 credit course.

NON-DISCRIMATORY POLICY

NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary admits male and female students of any race, color, nationality, or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded to students by our administration or educational polices.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The Seminary has specific student responsibilities and code of ethics. The responsibilities are recorded in the *Student Manual*, which each student receives when they register and enter the Seminary. The manual addresses both the traditional and correspondent student responsibilities. Listed below is a brief description of some general responsibilities taken from the Student Manual.

Dress

Traditional students are to dress properly while attending class and chapel service. Dress should always be modest and individual grooming should always be kept up. Questionable apparel will be left to the instructor or discretion of the seminary administer.

Class Attendance

Traditional students must attend each class in their study programs. Lateness is recorded and two late arrivals to class are considered as one absence. More than two absences', the student is dropped from the course. With special permission from the dean and instructor, consideration may be made for a special assignment to be done in place of one absence. In no case shall more than two absences be allowed in one semester period.

Ethics

Generally, Christian conduct and ethics shall govern the student body, its faculty, and administration according to the standards and principals of The Holy Bible. Christian love and respect toward one another is our highest standard and code of ethics.

The Seminary Chapel Service – Once a Month



CHAPEL SERVICE

The Seminary requires all students to attend a Chapel Service for all correspondent and distant learning students to attend its once a month Full Gospel service via the Seminary Virtual conference on line meeting via webinar.

SEMESTER PERIODS

The Seminary works on four-quarter semesters (three months each) for approximately twelve to fourteen weeks per semester. The Seminary makes provision for its students who have a regular full time work schedule to attend classes in the evenings and Saturday's. The quarter schedule seems to accommodate most of our students needs during the normal school calendar, as well as providing summer sessions in order that the student may complete 30 hours of credit per year.

Semester Campus Class Days

Student attends classes from their home or place of business, or church through distant learning in our virtual class room meetings via a webinar service. The class days for those subjects are assigned when the student enrolls into a scheduled program.

GRADING SYSTEM

Grading is calculated by the total amount of work meet by the student for that class. This effort put forth by the student is reflected in a letter ranking the superiority of their work. Along with this letter, students earn points for each credit they take. The combined points reflect the student's grade point average while enrolled in the seminary.

The following reflects the grading system used:

A passing grade for each class while in seminary is D-70 %.

Undergraduate Awards and credit hours required

1. Certificate – 30 credit hours of academics completed, for any year.
2. Associate Degree -2 years of academic work completed, 60 credits hours.
3. Graduate Diploma, 3 years of academic work completed, 90 credit hours.
4. Bachelor Degree in any of the 6 divisions of study for a total earned credits of 120 credit hours of completed academic work.

Graduate *master degree* awards and credits required.

All master degrees in any particular academic division must have a total of 150-160 credit hours of completed academic work and may have combinations of various studies but have at least 40 % in the specialty degree that the student wants to major in. The Master degree is 30-40 credits above the bachelor degree. Some majors may require additional credit hours above the normal 30 credits in a master program.

The Master program can be a combination of course works and essay projects (written papers) essays, book reports and thesis writing.

Graduate *Doctoral degree* awards and credits required.

All doctorate degrees in any particular academic division must have a total of 180-200 credit hours of completed academic work and may have combinations of various studies but have at least 50 % in the specialty degree that the student wants to major in. The doctorate degree is 30-40 credits above the master degree. Some majors may require additional credit hours above the normal 30 credits in a master program.

The doctorate degree program is a combination of many book surveys, personal writing, dissertation paper and practical lectures by the student in any church or bible school under the supervision of another doctor of ministry or PHD.

Thesis or Dissertation papers requirements.

1. If required for the Bachelor degree: Essay of 3,500- 4,500 words, double spaced, approximately 15 pages.
2. Requirement in the master degree: Thesis of 7,000 to 8,500 words, double spaced, approximately 20-24 pages.

3. Doctorate program a Dissertation is required of 9500 to 11,000 words approximately 30-34 pages.

Accelerated Degree Program for Ministry Purposes (ADPM)

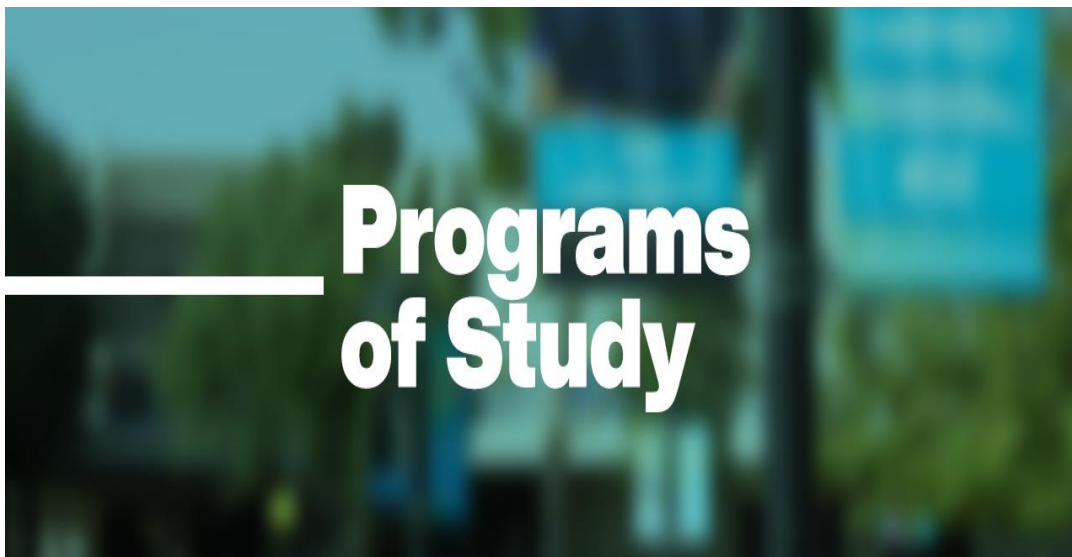
In or experience of 40 years in Christian education and ministry we have come in contact with many people who are in the work of the Lord, pastors, ministers and church bible teachers who have served many years in Church work, but do not have a degree to honor their efforts and work in the Church. These Christian servants have knowledge and experience equal to a Theological Degree that they should have acquired in a recognized Seminary.

For this reason, NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary offers these Christian servants our **ADPM** degree program. Degrees that can be earned are the bachelor through doctoral degree. These individuals must have the credit hours in any of the degree requirements listed in our Seminary. These credits are evaluated through the Seminary's *Life Experience Portfolio* process. Lacking credits can be made up by some simple course work, or by writing short essays and theses on subject matter.. Years of practical experiences will go towards these degrees, yet experiences in Christian Church work are most important.

Programs the Seminary Offers

We offer 44 courses through Harvestime International Institute, International Ministries, which are given in module group studies. These module studies may be taken for all certificates to degree programs studies the Seminary issues.

The Seminary has an additional 40 courses in its degree programs that can be taken for a degree or for random studies. Seminary Courses in advanced and degree programs:

- ◆ Pastoral Studies
- ◆ General Biblical Studies
- ◆ Pastoral/Biblical Counseling
- ◆ Missions/Evangelism
- ◆ Theology

We offer specialized course's that students may take by reading assignments and book reports.

Courses Through Home Study and Classroom as well as On-Line study.

Courses are approximately 150-300 pages each with student work questions and fill in.. They have an introduction for each subject and we furnish a curriculum outline for each subject. Each course has a final examination. The exams are sent via NYCFGTS and graded by us. The courses may be received by purchase of the book through Harvestime International or may be e-mailed to the student via PDF file from the Seminary.

Module 1: Introduction to Biblical Studies

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1) FOUNDATIONS OF FAITH: (3 credit hours)

This course stresses the importance of proper spiritual foundations for life and ministry by focusing on foundations of the Christian faith identified in Hebrews 6:1: Repentance, faith, baptism, laying on of hands, resurrection, and eternal judgment.

2) CREATIVE BIBLE STUDY METHODS: (3 credit hours)

This course equips students for personal study of the Word of God after the conclusion of Institute training. Students learn how to study the Bible by book, chapter, paragraph, verse, and word. Other methods taught include biographical, devotional, theological, typological, and topical. Special guidelines for studying Bible poetry and prophecy are presented and students are taught methods of charting and outlining.

3) OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY: (4 credit hours)

This survey provides an overview of the Old Testament. Study outlines of each book of the OT are provided for further development by the student. Volume One: Introduction and Old Testament.

4) NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY: (3 credit hours)

This survey provides an overview of the New Testament. Study outlines of each book of the NT are provided for further development by the student. Volume Two: New Testament.

5) Biblical Theology (Also Understood as Bible Doctrines) (3 credit hours)

The word "theology" comes from two Greek words, theos meaning "God" and logos meaning "the word" about or "the study of" God as He is revealed in the Scriptures. Simply defined, theology is an in-depth study of the Holy Bible to discover what God has said about Himself, His purposes, His plans, and His promises. The course covers the Trinity (Godhead, Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit) as well as Angels, Salvation, the Church and the Second coming of Christ.

Total credit hours in Module 1 equals 17 credits.

Undergraduate Tuition 17 x \$48. = \$816.00. Certificate issued at completion.

Individual courses may be taken for undergrad and graduate levels at the tuition fee per credit for that level of learning.

Module 2: Applying Biblical Studies: Personal

5) DEVELOPING A BIBLICAL WORLD VIEW: (3 credit hours)

This course examines the Biblical world view from Genesis through Revelation. God's plan for the nations of the world from the beginning of time is detailed. Current worldwide spiritual need is also presented.

6) KINGDOM LIVING: (3 Credit hours)

The "Gospel of the Kingdom" shall be preached in all the world before the return of the Lord Jesus Christ (Matthew 24:14). Understanding of Kingdom principles is necessary if one is to spread the Gospel of the Kingdom. This course focuses on patterns and principles of Kingdom living applicable to life and ministry.

7) KNOWING GOD'S VOICE: (3 credit hours)

This course explains how God speaks to men today and how to find His general and specific plans for life. A Christian model for decision making is presented, along with guidelines for overcoming wrong decisions, steps to take if you have missed the will of God, and methods for dealing with questionable practices.

8) MINISTRY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: (3 credit hours)

This study focuses on the ministry of the Holy Spirit, spiritual fruit, and spiritual gifts. Students are guided in discovery of their own spiritual gifts and position of ministry in the Body of Christ.

9) SPIRITUAL WARFARE: (3 credit hours)

This course moves participants beyond the natural world into the realm of the spirit. Tactics of the enemy are analyzed and strategies of spiritual warfare assuring victory over the principalities and powers of the spirit world are explained. See also Strategic Spiritual Warfare for additional credit.

10) POWER PRINCIPLES: (3 credit hours)

The early church was born in a demonstration of the power of God. Power principles taught in this course equip students for spiritual harvest and moves them from being spectators to demonstrators of the power of God.

Total credit hours in Module 2 equals 18 credits.

Module 3: Applying Biblical Studies: Community 26

11) MANAGEMENT PRINCIPLES: (3 credit hours)

A review of Biblical management principles with emphasis on servant leadership, Biblical leaders, and Scriptural strategies for success.

12) ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS: (3 credit hours)

Students learn environmental analysis on an individual, church, and organizational basis. They learn how to analyze the spiritual environment of a village, city, state or nation prior to penetrating it with the Gospel message

13) MANAGEMENT BY OBJECTIVES: (2 credit hours)

Everything Jesus did centered on the great purposes of God. This course analyzes Christ's objectives for ministry and teaches students to institute management by objectives in their own life and ministry.

14) MOBILIZATION METHODOLOGIES: (3 credit hours)

This course presents methods for mobilizing spiritual forces for God and explains the practical application of the Harvestime vision to specific areas of ministry. Referral courses in various areas of ministry are also available through this module.

15) LEAVEN LIKE EVANGELISM: (3 credits)

The Gospel of the Kingdom spreads throughout the world as leaven in bread dough: The leaven is small and hidden, but its impact is unlimited. Effective evangelism strategies are taught, including detailed instruction on the deliverance ministry, church planting, and techniques of networking between ministries.

16) STRATEGIES FOR SPIRITUAL HARVEST: (4 credit hours)

(Bible.org Seven Laws of the Harvest) and Harvestime International)

The initial call of Jesus Christ to men was to be spiritually reproductive: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." His final command, that of the Great Commission, also challenged followers to spiritual reproduction. Using the analogy of the natural harvest, this course focuses on promises of spiritual harvest, things that prevent harvest, and keys to effective harvest. It communicates the vision which the remainder of Institute training equips students to fulfill.

Total credit hours in Module 3 equals 18 credits

Undergraduate Tuition 18 x \$48. = \$864.00. Certificate issued at completion.

Individual courses may be taken for undergrad and graduate levels at the tuition fee per credit for that level of learning.

17) TEACHING TACTICS: (3 credit hours)

This course examines the methods Jesus used to teach and preach the Gospel. Students are taught how to prepare and present lessons and how to teach and preach the Gospel. A short essay is required on Biblical Teaching.

18) MULTIPLICATION METHODOLOGIES: (3 credit hours)

God's plan for spiritual multiplication is presented. This study reveals how a single Christian can be responsible for the multiplication of thousands of trained and motivated believers. There is a short study on Multiplying Discipleship by Every Nation Bible School that the student writes a short essay on the topic of multiplication discipleship.

19) JAIL AND PRISON MINISTRY: (3 credits hours)

A complete guide to jail and prison ministry. Includes guidelines for writing and visiting inmates, conducting group services inside an institution, reaching out to families of inmates, and ministering on death row. A separate study is required by reading a book by Christian Prison Ministry, manual and study guide by Nicholes Robbins. An essay is required after completion of this course.

20) WOMEN, A BIBLICAL PROFILE: (2 credit hours)

A study of all the Bible teaches about women and their role in ministry. Also includes a study of the Bible books bearing women's names—Ruth and Esther—and resources for biographical study of all of the women of the Bible.

21) INTERCESSORY PRAYER: (3 credit hours)

An intercessory prayer guide that includes guidelines on how to pray, what to pray for, when not to pray, resources for prayer, international intercession, and factors that hinder prayer. A separate study and book review, *The Ministry of Intercession* by Andrew Murry. Short essay is required.

22) BATTLE FOR THE BODY DIVINE HEALING: (3 credit hours)

A study of all that the Bible teaches about divine healing. Complete guidelines for receiving and ministering healing to the Body of Christ.

**Total credit hours in Module 4 equals 18 credits.

The following courses offered by Harvestime International Institute and NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary are supplement courses that can be taken from the Seminary for credit.

1. Alter Counseling Guide (2 credit hours)

Note to pastors, evangelists, and spiritual leaders: This manual is designed so you can easily personalize it for your own ministry. It covers most all questions a new believer may have after their acceptance of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. It addresses baptism, ordinance of the church, healing and deliverance as well as those areas the new believer encounters.

2. STUDY GUIDE TO THE BOOK OF ACTS (3 credit hours)

This is a NYC Full Gospel Course on the book of the Apostles (early history of the Church). The outline is taken from Gene Taylor's book "Investigating the Word of God, Acts. We also use The Legacy Bible Outline Series from Harvestime international, Book of Acts. This is a comprehensive study of Acts of the early Church and the Apostles.

3. Strategic Spiritual Warfare (2 credit hours) This course can be taken for extra credit.

Regardless of the misplaced emphasis on the subject of spiritual warfare, one thing is quite clear: Jesus recognized the daily struggles we all face, He acknowledged a very real spiritual enemy, (Satan) and He provided effective strategic spiritual guidelines for dealing with him. To be effective in spiritual warfare, we need to know these spiritual strategies and how to put them into action. It is for this reason that "Strategic Spiritual Warfare" has been written.

4. The Angels of God (3 credit hours)

The subject of this course is the righteous angels of God. It explains their origin, organization, and attributes. It summarizes the ministry of angels in the past, present, and future as recorded in the Bible. It also dispels common misconceptions about angels. As believers we do not want to exclude the truth concerning Gods ministering Spirits, and yet be caught up in "angel-mania", and ignore the viatal ministry of God's angels.

5. Biblical Meditation (2 credit hours)

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This study presents Biblical meditation as a spiritual discipline that is essential for Christians. It exposes the dangers of meditation diversions and defines Biblical meditation, its purposes, and its importance. The study includes practical suggestions for making time to meditate, preparing for meditation, and eliminating hindrances. Guidelines are given on meditation methods and selecting Scriptural topics for meditation. Each chapter includes study questions and practical steps for personal application.

6. Biblical Worship (6 credit hours)

This study is based on the Holy Bible, the written Word of the one true God, which reveals that all of creation has been called to worship. The angels (Hebrews 1:6); the nations (Psalm 86:9); the elements (Psalm 96:11); and God's people (Psalm 67:3). The goal is to enable you to understand biblical worship and inspire you to worship God in spirit and in truth. The course is for spiritual worship leaders and for all who want to experience the true worship meaning of God.

7. Divine Provision (Biblical Financial Strategies) (2 credit hours)

We are living in a time of tremendous financial instability. Rising debt, increasing unemployment, homelessness, and poverty are major concerns throughout the world. Businesses are failing. Nations that were formerly great economic giants are in financial upheaval. Christians and Leaders need to understand the financial instability to not only protect themselves, but to protect the Lord's Church.

8. Ministering in the Prophetic (3 credit hours)

If, you are a born-again, Spirit-filled, Bible-believing Christian who is desiring to serve at a new level of supernatural ministry, then you are about to begin an exciting spiritual journey. In this study you will learn that although not everyone is called to serve in the office of a prophet or has the spiritual gift of prophecy, every believer is called to minister in the prophetic. That includes you. The biblical principles shared in this book are for all Believers who are ministering or desiring to minister in the prophetic.

9. Muslim Manuel (3 credit hours)

Harvestime International Network as well as other Christian organizations are being asked for more information on the Muslim faith. Islam is the second largest religion in the world next to Christianity. Laity and clergy must understand the Islamic faith in order to protect the Christian Faith and our Christian God, the one and only true God. This course provides this most important information.

10. Strategic Spiritual Warfare (3 credit hours)

If there is one word to describe your daily life, most of us would say, boring, a daily routine, stressful, filled with struggles. Discouragement, disappointment and depression are a maze of things people go through. Did we ever stop and say, why? Christians understand why, the devil seeks to kill and to destroy. The course covers all aspects of spiritual warfare. The workbook assignments fulfil our quest for truth how to fight the enemy of God. This is a course and work-book for all believers.

11. Understanding Biblical Numbers (2 credit hours)

This study explains the importance of biblical numerology and provides guidelines for properly interpreting numbers. You will learn the meaning of selected numbers, their prophetic significance, and how to apply what you learn. These foundational studies will equip you to interpret the spiritual meaning of numbers used in scripture and provide the skills necessary for you to continue this fascinating study independently.

12. Legacy Bible Outlines for all 66 Books of the Bible

These outlines may be used for independent study or in a group. Each book of the Bible are included, Old and New Testaments. You do the reading and highlight all import facts in each book. To earn credit for these studies, you will write a short overview of each book of the bible you studied. These subjects may be used in all degree programs.

For each Legacy course in the Bible, the Seminary will inform the student the credits hours that will be given. **Each Bible Book study will be granted 3 credit hours from the Seminary at completion with essays at the end of each book.**

13. Writing and Producing Christian Materials (Legacy Course Productions) (2 credits hours)

We all like to write Christen materials, books, blogs, and courses and so on but feel it may be above our knowledge or abilities. The manual is grass roots how to write with the help and resource of the Holy Spirit. A ready course to begin writing with simple skills.

By writing an essay of 3000 words on a summary of the book, and with completing *Writing and Producing Christian Materials* you will earn a special certificate in *Christian Writing Publications*..

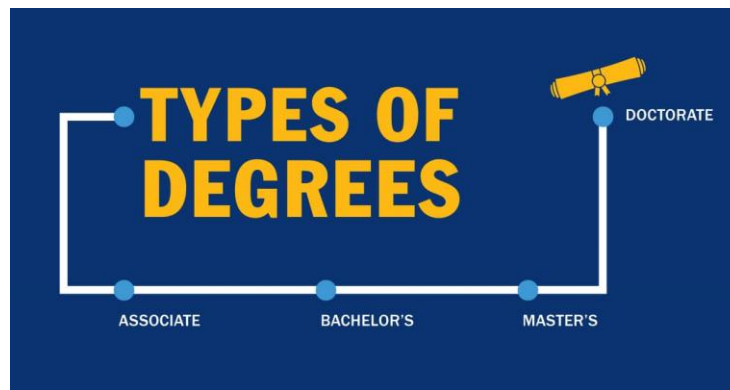

PROGRAMS AND DEGREES



Some students come in to seminary seeking to further their biblical knowledge, while others desire certification, licensing, and ordination. Because students come with different educational backgrounds, considerations are made. In order that the student may reach their desired goals, the seminary provides both *Undergraduate* and *Graduate* level programs suitable to the students needs. Study programs take into consideration the period for completion, payment plans, and certifications requested. Undergraduate and Graduate programs may be done traditionally or correspondently.

Assisting students in their academic pursuit, students enjoy a personal learning experience with their instructors. Along with this care, students may receive counseling (where advising and encouragement is available as a service) in order to address any needs they may have pertaining to leaving the seminary and entering Christian service.

Undergraduate Program

The Seminary understands the need for practical training for those who have a call to serve the Lord Jesus Christ in His church. The demand for well equipped Christian workers, ministers, and church leaders for the work they will undertake, is much more important than that of needless subjects which may never be used in an every day setting. The objective of the undergraduate program is to equip men and women in such a practical way.

The Seminaries undergraduate department offers both *degree* and *certificate* programs. If one wishes to further such documentations, one can study in the Graduate level and or seek credentialing, licensing, and ordination through NYC's *National Association of Pastors, Counselors, and Churches* (see Licensing and Credentialing). Both seminary and credentialing can be done simultaneously. Degree and certificate programs are listed below.

Degree Programs

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Associate Degree (60 Credits) -Two Years

Upon completing *60 credits* of education in *General Requirements in Bible and Theology*, the student receives an Associate Degree in Biblical Studies or Theology.

Graduate Ministerial Diploma (90 Credits) - Three Years

To receive this diploma, the student must finish an additional *30 credits* of education in the following major of their choice:

- A. Biblical Studies or Theology
- B. Pastoral Theology Ministry
- C. Christian Counseling
- D. Christian Education

Bachelors Degree (120 Credits) - Four Years

To receive this degree, the student must finish a supplemental *30 credits* of education in the following major of their choice:

- A. Biblical Studies or Theology
- B. Pastoral Theology Ministry
- C. Christian Counseling
- D. Christian Education

The Bachelor Program students must have completed to associate program of studies, 2 years of bible training courses.

Certificate Programs:

A. Certificate in Biblical Studies (30 credits) - First Year

B. Certificate in Advanced Biblical Studies (30 credits hours additional) - Second Year

For those who seek further education in the ministry and for personal achievement, the Seminary sponsors a Graduate level for the Master and Doctorate degree in:

- ◆ Biblical Studies or Theology
- ◆ Pastoral Theology Ministry
- ◆ Christian Pastoral Counseling
- ◆ Christian Education Ministry
- ◆ Missions

Students entering the graduate level complete written projects (paper) and practical projects in ministry. They complete course work in a specific field of study as recommended by the seminary *Board of Supervisors*. The Graduate level studies are a combination of subject courses as well as essay writing projects – self-study.

Masters Degree (150 Credits)

Students must complete an additional 30 credits above the Bachelor for a total of 150 credits.

Doctorate (180 Credits)

Upon completing an additional 30 credits above the Masters, for a total of 180 credits, the student receives their doctorate.

(Thesis or Dissertation papers requirements).

Research Paper and Practical Projects Requirements

Both the Masters and Doctorate Degree's require the student to complete a written thesis paper and project as listed below.

1. If required for the Bachelor degree: Essay of 3,500- 4,500 words, double spaced, approximately 15 pages.
2. Requirement in the master degree: Thesis of 7,000 to 8,500 words, double spaced, approximately 20-24 pages.
3. Doctorate program a Dissertation is required of 9500 to 11,000 words approximately 30-34 pages.

Additional Written Project Requirement.

Also required is a written project and a practical assignment the graduate will complete. This project incorporates preparing and presenting a seminar or conference lecture to an audience. The assignment must also be video or audio taped for seminary review.

Correspondent Program or Virtual Classroom Program

The Seminary offers both its Undergraduate and Graduate programs correspondently for some of its programs. These are self-paced, complete home studies. The work is the same as our virtual class program. The Virtual class program is classes held online through our distance learning program. In distant learning, the Seminary uses a teleconferencing network that enables the use of teaching tactics as in an actual classroom.



LICENSING AND ORDINATION



NYC Full Gospel Theological Seminary is an ecclesiastical organization with full exemption as a Church and issues credentials for ministry purposes only. The license or ordination credentials are solely for Church use and are not endorsement for any secular occupation for Federal or State agencies. Licensing and credentialing is offered through the seminaries *National Association of Pastors, Counselors, and Churches*.

The credentials are issued in vocational disciplines such as:

- ◆ Church Education Minister
- ◆ Christian or Pastoral Counselor
- ◆ Evangelist / Missionary
- ◆ Pastor / Elders / Preacher

Credentials can be added to degrees earned through the seminary; however, for ordination one must have been enrolled in the undergraduate Bachelors program. Both seminary and licensing education requirements can be done simultaneously. Listed below are the ministerial credentials offered and their requirements.

Ministerial Credentials

Certified Minister

Upon completing *60 credits* of education in the seminary, the *Certified Ministers* Credentials may be obtained. The students must undertake an additional *100 hours* of practical work under a supervisor of NYC'S Association and be approved by the Associations board for such. The Certified Minister Credentials can be in a major of their choice or the same as their Associate Diploma.

Licensed Minister

To be licensed as a Minister, the student must have undertaken 90 credits of seminary work. The student must also undertake an additional *150 hours* of practical work under a supervisor of NYC'S Association , take the course *Ministerial Training*, and be approved by the Associations board for their license. 20hrs of practical work will be deducted if completed in the undergrad program. The licensed Minister can be in a title of ones choice (pastor, evangelist etc...) or as an *Assistant Pastor*.

Ordained Minister

Completing a Bachelors Degree (120 credits), one can apply for ordination as an *Ordained Minister*. The students must have received the Bachelors Degree, undertaken an additional *200 hours* of practical work under a supervisor of NYC'S Association in their field of vocation, took the courses on *Ministerial Training* and *Minister Requirements*, and be approved by the Associations board for their ordination. Transfer students with a minimum of 90 credits must complete the additional *30 credits* in the Bachelors program. After completing 10 credits out of the 30, the transfer student may be ordained early.

EDUCATIONAL FACULTY

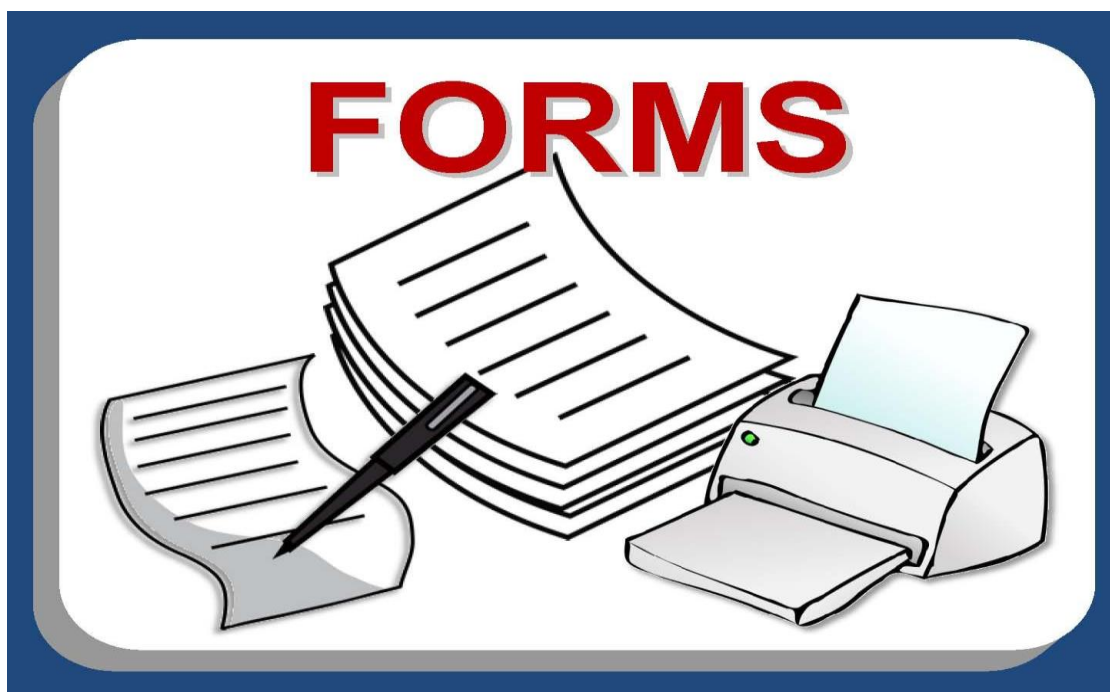

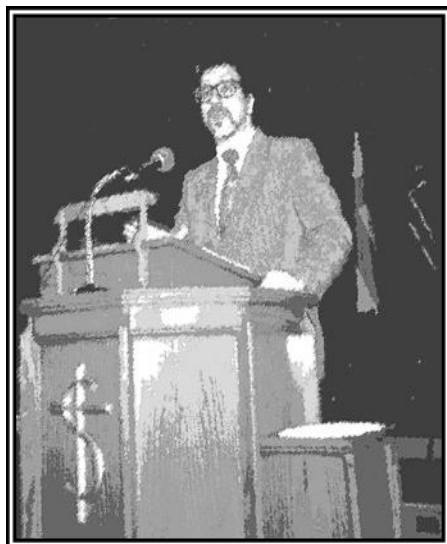

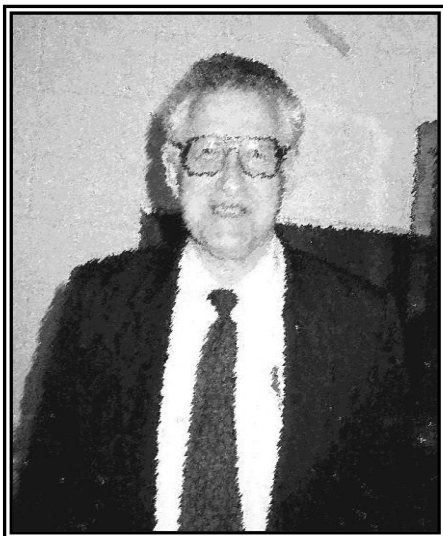
